Kindergarten: Mrs. Metz

The Kindergarten classroom has been a busy place during the month of September. The students are practicing the names and sounds of the consonant letters and the long sounds of the vowels. The two-vowel rule (when two vowels are in a word, usually the first vowel in the word, will say its name and the second vowel will be silent) is used to sound out three and four letter words. The K students are learning to print the lowercase letters of the alphabet. In math, they are learning to count from 0 to 100. The K class enjoys the afternoon classes of computer and art with Ms. Ghonouie, music with Ms. Murga, Spanish with Ms. Drummond, yoga with Ms. Aileen and P.E. with Ms. Vardeman's first grade class. In science, the students are learning about the four seasons, how apples grow and about animals. Our literature unit featured classic children's books, such as, "Jack and the Beanstalk", "The Three Billy Goats Gruff" and "The Little Engine That Could". Character development and having good manners are encouraged inside and outside the K classroom. Our class enjoyed their first field trip of the year to Central Library. The class is looking forward to our field trip in October, to the Tanaka Farms in Irvine, to pick pumpkins right out the field.







Preschool

Young children are in a constant period of learning about themselves and their environment and it will be our privilege to guide them in this process! We have been very busy this past month and all the children have been adjusting very well to their new classrooms and routines. We started to learn new shapes, letters, numbers, and we are also introducing new vocabulary. The two year olds are learning shapes, colors, and important self-help skills. Our pre-primary class is enjoying the "I am a mouse" lessons and the junior kindergarten class is working on the "Keep running, Allen" lesson and will start working in their letter workbook. Everyone is also enjoying their daily music lesson and weekly Spanish lessons. We are looking forward to getting to know your child throughout the school year and seeing them grow and mature!
